CAT 1 Basic Privileges: Patient management, including H & Ps and diagnostic and therapeutic treatments, procedures and interventions encompassing the areas described below and similar activities.

Requiring a level of training generally associated with persons who have completed the residency program prescribed by the American Board of Internal Medicine, and a level of skill and ability generally associated with persons who are diplomates of that board

- D Bone marrow aspiration**

Criteria: Documented Completion of the Central Venous Catheter Procedure Education and Training Module AND Documentation of at least one of the following: 1. Board Eligibility/Board Certification in specialties that include CVC Insertion and/or removal procedure as part of the basic delineated competencies (ie. Anesthesia, Cardiology, Emergency Medicine, General Surgery, Interventional Radiology and Nephrology). 2. Completion of one-month experience/rotation in Interventional Radiology. 3. Attestation or certification by Service Chief or Program Directors. 4. Documented supervised insertion procedures (5 internal jugular, 5 femoral, 5 PICC, 5 subclavian). Documented supervised removal procedures (2 non-tunneled lines)

M Muscle Biopsy

CAT 2 Subspecialty Privileges: Patient management at this level encompasses Category 1 patient management, the items marked below and similar activities.

Requiring a level of training generally associated with person who are Diplomates of the American Board of Internal Medicine and of the subspecialty board(s) designated below.

 - Initial Criteria:
 - 1. Observe two (2) patients undergoing ultrasound marking for percutaneous liver biopsy.
 - 2. Participate in one (1) hour of training in the use of the ultrasound machine supervised by one (1) of the Radiology faculty in the UCSF Ultrasound Section.
 - 3. Perform five (5) ultrasound markings for liver biopsy under supervision by an Attending Radiologist.
 - Maintenance Criterion: 1. Perform a minimum of twenty (20) ultrasound-guide percutaneous liver biopsies every two (2) years.

- 13 Endoscopic placement of biliary endoprosthesis**
- 14 Colonoscopy with biopsy**
- 15 Hemorrhoidal infrared coagulation**

- 19 Endoscopic electrocoagulation of bleeding sites**
- 20 Endoscopic laser fulguration of tumors (LASER)**
- 21 Ambulatory esophageal PH monitoring**

- 24 Moderate Sedation**
 - Criteria: Successful completion of Sedation Module Required prior to granting of privileges, and current ACLS Certification
- CAT 3 Special Privileges**

E Intestinal Ultrasound (IUS) for point of care exam in Gastroenterology Clinics for Inflammatory Bowels Disease Patients

Initial Criteria: Completion of option A or B as indicated below.

A) UCSF IUS credentialing pathway which include

- i. Completion of International Bowel Ultrasound (IBUS) course, which includes three modules and completion of an exam at the end of the third module (further information available on <https://ibusgroup.org/>), or equivalent didactic training in IUS.
 - 1. Courses/training other than the IBUS modules will be reviewed for equivalency by the principal intestinal sonographer on a case-by-case basis.
 - 2. Further information on the IBUS training program is available on [ibus-group.org](https://ibusgroup.org/)

B) At least 40 observed ultrasounds, with either direct oversight or documented review by those trained in intestinal ultrasound

Renewal Criteria: Maintenance of certification (annual) will involve completion of both items below:

- A) Perform or supervise at least 25 IUS exams every year, which will be formally reviewed and tracked by the principal intestinal sonographer.
- B) At least one Intestinal ultrasound-related CME activity annually
 - i. Internal: UCSF IUS longitudinal curriculum or course participation.
 - ii. External: to be reviewed and approved on case-by-case basis by the principal intestinal sonographer.

Proctoring Criteria: Documentation of initial proctoring and ongoing use of intestinal ultrasound with acceptable accuracy rate as determined by the principal intestinal sonographer. Accuracy of findings will be determined by the principal intestinal sonographer who will supervise a minimum of 5 ultrasounds per year. Accuracy can also be compared with endoscopy findings or other forms of imaging including MRI and CT scan.

F Ambulatory Surgery Center (ASC) Privileges, Peninsula Outpatient Center (POPC)
Outpatient gastroenterology privileges: Colonoscopy, Upper Endoscopy. Polypectomy, Biopsies, Foreign Body Removal, Balloon Dilation, Mucosal Resection/Hydro Debridement, Flexible Sigmoidoscopy, Enteroscopy, and Coagulation
