CAT 1 Basic Privileges: Patient management including H & Ps and diagnostic and therapeutic treatments, procedures and interventions encompassing the areas described below and similar activities.

Requiring a level of training generally associated with persons who have completed the residency program in neurology prescribed by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology, and a level of skill and ability generally associated with diplomates of that board.

A Diagnosis and management of medical neurological illnesses in adults excluding those areas described under Category 3 below.

CAT 2 Subspecialty Privileges: Patient management at this level encompasses Category 1 patient management, the areas checked below and similar activities.

Requiring a level of training, skill and ability generally associated with persons who are Diplomates in Neurology of the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology and of the subspecialty board(s) designated below.

A Child neurology

CAT 3 Special Privileges: Patient management at this level encompasses Categories 1 and 2 (if applicable), the items specifically marked below and similar activities.

Requiring a level of training, skill and ability generally associated with persons who are Diplomates of the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology, and who have had additional training and/or experience in specific patient management problems.

A Clinical neurophysiology

B Moderate Sedation

(Sedation Module Required prior to granting of privilege)

C Management of headaches and related disorders in children

D Consultant on End of Life Option

a physician who has specific training to ensure compliance with the UCSF protocol on End Of Life Option. This medical practitioner can accept referrals from other UCSF credentialed providers to assess patient suitability for this Option.

E Administer Intrathecal Medications

Adult patients with spinomuscular atrophy (SMA) or Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS) associated with SOD1 gene mutation will receive nusinersen (Spinraza) or Tofersen.

Initial criteria: Current or board eligibility in Neurology by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology (ABPN) or the American Osteopathic Board of Neurology and Psychiatry (AOBNP), or foreign training and board equivalency.

Renewal Criteria: 8 Injections per reappointment cycle

Proctoring criteria: 4 encounters with satisfactory outcomes for each requested procedure must be submitted to complete proctoring.

CAT 4 Limited Privileges

Patient management limited to the areas specified below. (For members of the

Associate Staff, these areas must correspond to written protocols approved by the Credentials Committee of the Medical Staff.)
