CAT 1 Basic Privileges: Patient management, including H & Ps and diagnostic and therapeutic treatments, procedures and interventions including the areas described below and similar activities.

Requiring a level of training generally associated with persons who have completed the residency program prescribed by the American Board of Pediatrics, and a level of skill and ability generally associated with persons who are diplomates of that board.

A Preventive medical services and medical care of children from birth through adolescence

(excluding those areas described in Category 3 below.)

CAT 2 Subspecialty Privileges: Patient management at this level encompasses Category 1 patient management, the areas checked below and similar activities.

Requiring a level of training, skill and ability generally associated with persons who are diplomates of the American Board of Pediatriacs and of the subspecialty board(s) designated below.

Requiring a level of training generally associated with persons who are

Diplomates of the American Board of Medical Specialties, Hospice and Palliative Medicine and as defined by the ACGME core competencies for fellowship in HPM.

- 02 Palliative Sedation (limited to Pediatric Palliative Care Attending)
- 03 Recommendations for intravenous infusion of medications
- 04 Prescription of controlled substances (valid DEA certificate required)
- 05 Management of patient-controlled analgesia
- Of Symptom management including patient and family education, psychosocial and spiritual support, and appropriate referrals for other modalities such as invasive procedures
- O7 At end of life, removal of endotracheal tubes and other life-sustaining therapies
- 08 Telemedicine
- CAT 3 Special Privileges: Patient management at this level encompasses Categories 1 and 2 (if checked) patient management, the items specifically marked below and similar activities

Requiring a level of training, skill and ability generally associated with persons who are diplomates of the American Board of Pediatrics and who have had additional training and/or experience in specific patient management problems.

- A Pediatric cardiac catheterization
- B Chemotherapy for malignant disease
- C Renal Procedures
- 2 Hemodialysis, Peritoneal Dialysis, Continuous renal replacement therapy
- 4 Percutaneous renal biopsy
- 6 Percutaneous iliac crest bone biopsies
- D Cardiopulmonary support (intensive care)
- E Pulmonary diseases

R Acupuncture

Initial Criteria: Completion, by a licensed physician, of a 200-hour ACCME-accredited course in Medical Acupuncture which consists of both theory and training. This course will allow the physician to perform acupuncture, acupressure, and moxibustion.

Maintenance Criteria: Documentation of at least 10 procedures.

S 1 - Endocrinology - Histrelin implant and removal procedural privilege
Initial Criteria: Sub-specialty certification in Pediatric Endocrinology or Adolescent
Medicine, AND 3 procedures observed with proctor

Maintenance Criteria: At least 6 procedures performed over the past 24 months

Proctoring Criteria: 3 proctored procedures with successful outcomes

S 2 - Endocrinology - Testopel implant procedural privilege

Initial Criteria: Sub-specialty certification in Pediatric Endocrinology or Adolescent Medicine, AND 3 procedures observed with proctor

Maintenance Criteria: At least 6 procedures performed over the past 24 months

Proctoring Criteria: 3 proctored procedures with successful outcomes

CAT 4 Limited Privileges: Patient management limited to the areas specified below.

(For members of the Associate Staff, these areas must correspond to written protocols approved by the Credentials Committee of the Medical Staff.)

- B Pediatric dentistry only
- C Pediatric dermatology only
- D Pediatric intensive care only
