**CAT 1 Basic Privileges - Psychiatrists: Patient management, including H&P's and diagnostic and therapeutic treatments, procedures and interventions encompassing the areas described below and similar activities.**

**Basic Psychiatry privileges require a level of training generally associated with psychiatrists who have completed the residency program prescribed by the Accreditation Council of Graduate Medical Education, and a level of skill and ability generally associated with persons who are diplomats of the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology. Patient management of children requires a level of training, skill and ability generally associated with persons who have, in addition a Subspecialty Certificate in Child and Adolescent Psychiatry. Only qualified psychiatrists may admit patients to Langley Porter Psychiatric Hospitals and Clinics.**

Requiring a level of training generally associated with psychiatrists who have completed the residency program prescribed by the Accreditation Council of Graduate Medical Education, and a level of skill and ability generally associated with persons who are diplomates of the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology. Patient management of children requires a level of training, skill and ability generally associated with persons who have, in addition, a Subspecialty Certificate in Child and Adolescent Psychiatry. Only qualified psychiatrists may admit patients to Langley Porter Psychiatric Hospitals and Clinics. Patient management by clinical psychologists requires licensure by the California Board of Psychology. Specific current competence demonstrated by education, training and experience related to patient management of children and adolescents and neuropsychological testing are required for privileges in these areas.

**A Adult Psychiatry ( $\geq 16$  years of age) Includes: Diagnostic and physical evaluation, pharmacotherapy, psychotherapy of inpatient, partial hospitalization patients and outpatient adults and supervision of trainees.**

**B Child/Adolescent Psychiatry ( $< 18$  years of age) Includes: Diagnostic and physical evaluation, pharmacotherapy, psychotherapy of children/adolescents and supervision of trainees with this population**

**CAT 2 Basic Privileges - Psychologists: Patient management, including diagnostic and therapeutic treatments, procedures and interventions encompassing the areas described below and similar activities.**

**Basic Psychology privileges require licensure by the California Board of Psychology. Specific current competence demonstrated by education, training and experience related to patient management of children and adolescents and neuropsychological testing are required for privileges in these areas.**

**A Adult Psychology ( $\geq 16$  years of age) Includes: Diagnostic evaluation, psychotherapy, advanced psychological testing of adults and supervision of trainees with this population**

**B Child/Adolescent Psychology ( $< 18$  years of age) Includes: Diagnostic evaluation, psychotherapy, advanced psychological testing of**

**children/adolescents and supervision of trainees with this population****CAT 3 Special Privileges****A Psychiatry****1 Pre & Post Care for Electroconvulsive Therapy: LPPH&C ONLY****3 Adolescents 12 - 16 years of age****4 Children less than 12 years of age**

For privileges 03 and 04 above, a level of training generally associated with psychiatrists who have completed the adult residency program prescribed by the Accreditation Council and a level of skill and ability generally associated with persons who are diplomats of the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology is required. Consultation, evaluation and management of children in the specified age group are limited to a specific disease model. Evidence of expertise in a specific psychiatric disease model is required (e.g. peer reviewed original research in that area dealing with children or adolescents and demonstrating clinical expertise). Evidence of significant clinical work with children in the requested age group in the specified area is required (e.g. letters of recommendation from this or a prior institution.) Twenty-five percent of CME activity should be directly related to the special privileges.
