

APP - Certified Nurse Midwife (CNM) Privileges Form

MEDS MEDICATION

Administer, dispense, and prescribe drugs and provide treatment within the CNM's scope of practice, as designated in the standardized formulary and consistent with the CNM's skill, training, competence, professional judgment, and policies of the medical center.

Initial Criteria:

Current California Registered Nurse (RN) License without restriction

AND

Current California Nurse Midwife License without restriction

AND

Current California Nurse Midwife Furnishing Number including Schedule 2

AND

Current Federal Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) registration with Schedules 2, 2N, 3, 3N, 4, and 5 for Controlled Substance Formulary and Specialty Formulary

AND

Current CURES Registration

Maintenance/Renewal Criteria:

Maintenance of unrestricted California RN and Nurse Midwife licensure, Nurse Midwife Furnishing Number including Schedule 2, DEA registration for Schedules 2, 2N, 3, 3N, 4, and 5, and CURES registration

CORE CORE PRIVILEGES

BASIC CORE CNM PRIVILEGES (These privileges apply to all CNMs)

Initial and ongoing assessment of a patient's medical, physical, and psychosocial status including:

- 1. Completing histories and physical examinations
- 2. Developing treatment plans, goals of care, and advanced care plans
- 3. Providing general or specialty consultation to other providers
- Performing daily rounds
- 5. Establishing primary and secondary diagnoses as well as determining complications, comorbidities, and present on admission (POA) conditions
- 6. Writing progress notes and discharge summaries as required by UCSF medical center policies

and procedures

- 7. Ordering diagnostic tests, monitoring, and therapeutic modalities such as medications, treatments and, examinations
- 8. Providing primary health care for women and infants during pregnancy, childbirth, and postpartum period; care of newborns; and the family planning and gynecological needs of women throughout the life cycle
- 9. Episiotomy and laceration repair (1st and 2nd degree)
- 10. Intrauterine contraception insertion and removal
- 11. Subdermal contraception insertion and removal
- 12. Ordering rehab
- 13. Ordering durable medical equipment
- 14. Ordering home health services and supplies
- 15. Determining disability and work status

May not be the admitting provider of record

Initial Criteria:

<u>Formal Training</u>: Successful completion of an accredited CNM program with a master's or doctoral degree

AND

National Board Certification: Current certification by the American Midwifery Certification Board AND

Current California Registered Nurse (RN) License without restriction

AND

Current California Nurse Midwife License without restriction

AND

Current California Nurse Midwife Furnishing number including Schedule 2

AND

Current American Heart Association Basic Life Support (BLS) certification

AND

Current Neonatal Resuscitation Program (NRP) certification

AND

Experience as a Nurse Midwife and two peer references (satisfactory or better) OR Level II Focused Professional Practice Evaluation (FPPE)

<u>Assessment of Competency</u> will be conducted by the supervising physician or designee through the FPPE process (level I or II based on prior clinical experience as a nurse midwife and peer references) until the level of performance is determined to be meets expectations (satisfactory)

<u>Provisional core privileges</u> are granted based on license type and successfully completing the UCSF credentialing process

<u>Core privileges</u> are granted after the Nurse Midwife has demonstrated competency through the FPPE process and submitted at least five activity logs via the <u>UC Me e-Log system</u>. OMAG identifies approved privileges on the <u>ECHO website</u>.

Maintenance/Renewal Criteria:

Maintenance of accepted Nurse Midwife National Board Certification

AND

Maintenance of CA Licensure as an RN, Nurse Midwife, and Nurse Midwife Furnishing Number including Schedule 2

AND

Maintenance of American Heart Association Basic Life Support (BLS) certification

AND

Maintenance of American Heart Association NRP certification

AND

<u>Continuing Medical Education</u>: Documentation of compliance with the Board of Registered Nursing of California CEU requirements for re-licensure. Educational activities must relate, in

part, to the privileges requested and granted

AND

<u>Competency Assessment</u>: Current demonstrated competence and documentation of successful treatment to a minimum of patients, set forth by the Chair/Chief of Department, for the past 24 months based on results of quality assessment/improvement activities and outcomes AND

Complete core privilege and standardized procedure <u>UCME e-Logs</u>
